Induction of Rev Chris Wallace - Wednesday 6th April at 7pm in East Mainland Church

It's exciting news! Just a couple of weeks ago the Rev Chris Wallace preached in East Mainland Church as your Sole Nominee, having been invited by your Nominating Committee. They had interviewed him, listened to him preach themselves and shown him round the parish, church and manse. Chris was voted for unanimously by the congregation of East Mainland and accepted their call to come and be minister here.

So on 6th April the induction will take place at 7pm, and the Presbytery will install Chris as your minister. I hope that as many of you as possible will come and support him as he begins his journey with you. Chris is an experienced minister and is qualified in many other areas, having served on lots of the Kirk's committees at national level. He has been a Street Pastor and is a trainer in First Aid and he is really looking forward to the Orkney experience! Chris' two sons and his daughter are grown up and married and he has four grand children down in the south west of Scotland, so I imagine they too will be looking forward to Orkney holidays – I hope so.

The Church nationwide is changing in the way it operates, with many positions being centralised, even here in Orkney, but hopefully we ought not to notice much difference in the local parishes. My last newsletter was back in November 2019! Since then, it has been a very different couple of years for everyone. The school closed and pupils started home learning. This was all new to both pupils and the staff, but everyone adapted and worked very well together despite the major change in routines. The school has been back open for a while now, and it was great to see how quickly the children settled back into their routines.

Children in Need 2021

Lots of exciting activities took place in school in aid of BBC's annual 'Children in Need' appeal. The children came dressed in spots, stripes or bright colours and the staff dressed as dalmatians with the Primary 4 teacher, Mrs Spence as Cruella de Vil. Games included Pudsey colouring and drawing competitions, treasure hunt, guess how many sweets in the jar and a virtual bake off. St Andrews Primary School raised a grand total of £1102.71.



Harvest Assembly

A total of £222.00 was raised at our Harvest Assembly last year. This money was donated to the local charity THAW Orkney. It will go towards providing vulnerable families with Cosy Home Packs and electricity vouchers. Since THAW started in 2014, they have supported over 350 households with their Cosy Home Packs. Thank you very much to everyone that donated.



School Build

If you have been passing the school recently you may have seen the school extension going up. This additional space includes a new nursery, PE hall and office. The work started in March 2020 and was due to be completed in March this year but has been significantly delayed due to the disruptions caused by COVID 19. Our new PE Hall is wind and watertight and progressing well inside and the new nursery building is starting to take shape. The main entrance and the new school office will be situated in the new nursery extension.

Looking Ahead

I am delighted to announce that our Primary 7 pupils are going to have the opportunity in June to take part in a 4-day residential trip at the Hoy Outdoor Centre. This is a great opportunity for our P7 pupils to develop, team working skills and emotional resilience as they experience a short period of separation from home. Activities will include; hill walking, canoeing, gorge walking, orienteering and coast steering.
